EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

It was a good year! I'm proud to say we had a positive year financially, our summer theatre attendance grew, our membership hit an all-time high, we had new programs and fun events, and we completed the second phase of restoration. We were successful on many fronts.

I think it's important to note, the success which Tibbits achieved this year was a culmination of the past five years and investments and growth in many areas. We did not reach a profitable year in just 12 months. We began five years ago investing in computers, software, personnel, membership and marketing. We changed the way Tibbits operated and the way Tibbits was perceived. The investment sent us further into debt on the short term so we could realize greater gains in the long run.

Reviewing the executive director's reports over the past five years reveals an intriguing progression of changes. We went from unbridled optimism in 2001, to the risk taking and changes of 2002. In 2003 we struggled as we suffered the costs of the risk-taking without yet seeing the benefits. 2004 was filled with reassurances, that "*Rome wasn't built in a day;*" we were seeing successes and we needed to focus on the positive and keep working. 2005 focused on teamwork and the successes we were starting to see.

It *was* a good year, but it was just one year. There's still a lot of work to do and a lot of room to grow. We need to continue investing and working toward steady progress. As members, donors, sponsors and even patrons, please don't think you're not needed. Nothing is further from the truth. With each success, we raise the bar. If we reach 14,000 children one year, we want to reach 15,000 the next. If we stay content we will not continue to be the vibrant arts organization this community needs.

TIBBITS OPERA HOUSE ENDOWMENT

Tibbits 26th Anniversary Auction - November 2005

Norton Auctioneers once again provided the live auctioneer services for the fun and entertaining evening. Over fifty volunteers worked prior to and during the auction to help make it a reality. One hundred and fifty-four bidder numbers were distributed the night of the auction. An amazing \$53,871 was grossed, while netting \$46,803.57. More than 350 businesses were contacted for donations.

Prior to the show patrons were treated to a private tour of the Fox Theatre. All Season’s Travel teamed with Tibbits to host this wonderful theatre trip which was exciting for all.

PROGRAMMING

Each year the Tibbits is host to a large variety of local, regional and nationally known programming. Each time the curtain rises at the Tibbits, we may be entertaining, educating, creating an awareness, or simply coming together as a community. The events may be different, but each one at the Tibbits gives this community a stage in which to experience live entertainment. Over 169 days last year, the spotlight was on and the curtain was up.

Locally, we welcomed the incredibly talented and entertaining Branch County Community Theatre. Their dedication to the craft of theatre is ever present and includes some truly gifted individuals. Each year BCCT presents four plays including the Pickering Award winning original play chosen from over 150 submissions from across the country. Tibbits is one of a very few community theatres to have this type of exposure and distinction.

Both the Legg Middle School and Coldwater High School used Tibbits this past year for their annual theatre productions. Many community organizations use the Tibbits annually for dance and guitar recitals, band concerts, pageants, the Rotary Show, conferences and seminars. In addition Tibbits uses it for Special Events (page 12), Tibbits Young Audiences, School Programming and Tibbits Summer Theatre (page 10).

Over the years Tibbits has hosted performers from all over the world. We embrace the responsibility of providing a variety of entertainment for our community and understand that through these efforts we are expanding our base of Tibbits patrons and patrons of the arts.

In October 2005, we were excited to welcome back blues legend Larry Garner followed by another wonderful performance of The Chinese Golden Dragon Acrobats. The Saline Fiddlers provided some holiday entertainment in December. In July, audiences enjoyed Cahula & Cream for their second year of a nearly sold out show.

This past year we created an Entertainment Series and a Family Entertainment Series. These series proved to be a success and sold almost one quarter of our 500 seat theatre in the initial ticket offering during the month of June. Our Entertainment Series kicked off with a sold-out performance by headliner Jeff Daniels, from The Purple Rose Theatre in nearby Chelsea, Michigan. Academy-award-nominated actor Daniels has written over 400 songs during his 30 year career as an amateur songwriter and left the audience wanting just one more song.

Our Family Entertainment Series kicked off with The Candy Band in September. This group of four suburban Detroit moms knew how to “punk out” nursery rhymes to the delight of clapping, dancing children.

We continue to build our programming and every year take another step in an effort to provide “something for everyone” so that we may all sit back and enjoy what Barton S. Tibbits dreamed of for this community; a place to experience live entertainment.

TIBBITS YOUNG AUDIENCES (CON'T)

Each year Tibbits Young Audiences (TYA) brings the arts to youth. The intent is to educate and inspire. To stretch their minds, to build self-esteem, and teach self-discipline.

In March 2006, TYA presented *Twinderella*. Under the direction of Lois Voss and Julia Littley, producers Jayne Lillis and Karen Long and musical director Waive Wardwell, 50 children in grades 4 through 8 experienced excitement as well as the hard work of musical theatre. The show was a twist on the classic tale of *Cinderella* in which Cinderella has a twin brother Bob. While Cinderella has evil stepsisters and longs to go to the ball, Bob has evil stepbrothers and longs to go to the all-kingdom baseball game.

Besides the value of performing on the stage in front of an audience of family and peers, each show provides the student performers a chance to develop a character, create a costume, learn lines, sing, dance and perform in front of a live audience. Students also learn about the technical aspects of staging a performance. It's an invaluable experience that they will carry with them through life.

TYA's school programming effort brings students opportunities to enjoy performing artists they otherwise are unlikely to experience. This past year they were treated an awesome performance of Chinese Golden Dragon Acrobats in the fall. Six schools plus the home-school network participated. In the spring eight schools participated in TheatreWorks USA's production of *Ramona Quimby* based on the Beverly Cleary books.

In March Legg Middle School enjoyed a particularly timely presentation of civil rights leader Rosa Parks as presented by Rosie Chapman. Chapman is highly regarded nationally, as well as internationally for her characterizations and her ability to bring history to life.

In May puppeteer Joyce Davis presented *The Case of the Missing Pearl* to pre-school and lower elementary students. Her creative and energetic performance used puppets to help weave a tale in which the children participated and helped solve the mystery.

In addition to these presentations, many school groups and children's organizations participated in tours of the historic Tibbits Opera House throughout the year. The rich architectural and theatrical history of Tibbits is unlike any other structure in southern Michigan and we are thrilled to be able to share it with so many individuals.

ART GALLERY

For several months this year donated “Ducks Unlimited” prints swam onto the gallery walls. Proceeds from these prints go directly to the restoration project.

Two “Variety is the Spice of Life” exhibits filled the gallery during summer stock. Four area artists were featured in the first exhibit, which opened in June with “Oliver.” With help from Branch Area Career Center staff, “Spotlight on a Young Artist” returned to focus on the work of Ruben Flores-Almanza, a 2006 graduate of Bronson High School. Bev Tippmann, Coldwater resident and artist, shared her pastels and watercolors, describing her work as “expressionistic,” and admitting that she loves strong colors. “Spicer Arts,” the creation of Marshall artists Janet and Pete Williams, displayed their impressive thrown and hand built pottery. Pete is an art instructor at Kellogg Community College in Battle Creek, and Janet works in their home studio. Work from these four artists was on display through closing night of “Arsenic and Old Lace.”

Second “Variety is the Spice of Art” exhibit featured fine art by Douglas Wolfe and Bill Williams. Wolfe, a design consultant who teaches at Western Michigan University, brought a colorful, free wheeling exhibit of field art to Tibbits. Battle Creek artist Bill Williams, known nationally for sports art, exhibited finely detailed, still life paintings. James Freeman, a potter who resides in Manitou Beach and teaches at Adrian College, exhibited a variety of ceramic pieces, from Sake bottles and cups to intriguing adventurous “Ring Bottles.” He and his wife attended opening night of “Grease,” and enjoyed both the play and Tibbits.

Erica Sword, costume designer for a second summer at Tibbits, exhibited original renderings of costume designs accompanied by fabric samples and photographs of her finished work. All four artists agreed to leave their work on display for an extended time to include “You Never Know,” “Cahlua & Cream” and “An Evening with Jeff Daniels.”

All summer exhibitors are offered opening night comp tickets as a thank you for sharing their work with Tibbits. Exhibitors benefit Tibbits in quiet ways; many come into the theater for the first time when they bring their work to the gallery, and most return to enjoy both the historic setting and the live performances.

Fall brought the annual “Battle of the Bands,” which arrived with a unique art exhibit. Toi Collective kindly coordinated this show in my absence. This exhibit was followed by a showing of prints from the US-12 Heritage Route—the Old Sauk Trail—which tied in with the Branch County premiere of “Moccasins to Main Street.”

Fiscal year 2005-2006 was an exciting year of progress in the effort to restore and improve Tibbits Opera House. Tibbits Opera Foundation Board of Directors is pleased to announce many accomplishments throughout the year.

Volunteers see red! The fiscal year began with eighteen volunteers painting inside the new addition that houses the accessible entrance, accessible restroom and the elevator built during Phase II of the restoration. Phase II of the Tibbits Opera House restoration is now complete with the final coat of paint being applied November 28, 2005. Volunteers painted the two-story elevator lobby, the stairwell, the stairs, the handrails, doors, doorframes and the new accessible restroom.
